
THREE SCRANTON MINES RESUME OPERATIONS.

**Two Wounded Strikers Arrested in
Shenandoah—Militiamen Chased by
Mob—Situation Elsewhere.**

SCRANTON, Pa., Aug. 5.—The Dickson Colliery of the Delaware and Hudson Railroad Company in Green Ridge resumed operations to-day with returned strikers. Superintendent Rose says the company has been cutting and loading coal at this mine for two weeks. To-day the coal was hoisted and sent through the breaker. The company will not give out the number of men who are working.

This makes three collieries now in operation in this city. The other two are the Oxford, of the People's Coal Company, and the Cayuga, of the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western. Superintendent Tobey of the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western said to-day that his company will start up another colliery to-morrow. The strikers are making no very serious effort to prevent men from working at these collieries.
