

A Day's Casualties in the Coal-Mines.

SCRANTON Penn., March 25.—MICHAEL CARROLL, a laborer employed in the Dodge shaft, was killed by a fall of top coal, this morning. He leaves a wife and five children.

PATRICK FENERTY was killed, and **STEPHEN FENERTY**, his brother, was severely injured, by a premature explosion at Gipsey Grove Colliery, today. **PATRICK** was in the act of charging for a blast when the explosion took place, injuring him so severely that he died before reaching his home. His brother **STEPHEN**, who was close by, was also seriously injured.

A driver by the name of **MAYHARDT**, aged about fourteen years, was instantly killed today at the Laurel Run Works, of the Glenwood Coal Company. He was sitting on a car, driving it up a run, when, in leaning over, he lost his balance and fell to the ground, breaking his neck.

A miner, name unknown, was severely burned today by an explosion of gas at Stark's Colliery, Pleasant Valley.
