

FOUND DEAD IN THE MINE.

SCRANTON, Penn., April 23.—Charles Dunleavy, a mule driver in the Edgerton Colliery, a short distance from this city, was found dead in the mine last night. He had been sent with a mule to pull a coal car from the foot of the shaft to the chamber, and being absent an unusual length of time, his comrade went in search of him, and found him lying dead in the narrow road. The mule and car stood a short distance from the body of the dead boy, and there were no marks of violence visible to indicate how he had met his death. A close examination resulted in finding a small black mark on Dunleavy's breast like an ink spot, and it is thought possible that he was squeezed to death between the car and the roof of the mine.
