

NON-UNION MINERS SHOT.

Two Men Employed at the Edgerton (Penn.) Colliery Wounded by Strikers, It Is Believed.

SCRANTON, Penn., Aug. 19.—Michael Connelly and Forrest Crossman, said to be non-union workmen employed about the Edgerton colliery, were shot from ambush to-day, presumably by strikers.

Crossman was so badly injured that it was necessary to amputate his right foot, Connelly's condition is regarded as serious.

The men were working on a water course near the breaker when a bullet whizzed close to Crossman's head. Connelly says he thought the shot had been fired by mine guards, and shouted a warning. Two more shots followed, a bullet lodging in Crossman's leg and a charge of shot shattering Connelly's shoulder. Some of the shot hit him in the face.
