

CRUSHED TO DEATH IN A MINE.

WILKESBARRE, Penn., Jan. 13.—A car loaded with miners, which was being lowered down the three-hundred foot shaft of the Gaylord slope at Plymouth this morning, when near the bottom was suddenly stopped and raised from its position before the men had alighted. One of them, George Sage, was thrown from the car and caught between it and the side of the shaft as the car was redescending. As soon as the car could be stopped Sage's body, which was crushed to an unrecognizable mass, was recovered. He was a married man, 42 years old.
