

CAVE-IN OF A COAL MINE.

WILKESBARRE, Penn., Dec. 20.—An extensive cave-in occurred in the Gaylord Slope of the Kingston Coal Company to-day. The breaker parted about seven inches, and the machinery was rendered almost worthless. Three veins—the Baltimore, Cooper's, and the five-foot or so-called "upper vein"—have gone down, filling up the breasts and gangway, and making it impossible for any one to enter the mine for the present.

The loss to the company cannot now be estimated, but it will reach several thousand dollars.
