

TROUBLE AMONG MINERS.

SCRANTON, Penn., June 9.—There was a stormy scene at the Grassy Island colliery, near Peckville, a few miles north of Scranton, this morning. As a party of about 60 men were on their way to work they were attacked and stoned by a crowd of about 500 men and boys, who denounced them in bitter terms for having taken the places of men who went on strike a few weeks ago. The blacklegs fired upon their assailants and wounded two of them, after which the crowd dispersed. The company has appealed to Sheriff Lewis for assistance, as it expects a renewal of the trouble to-morrow.

It is reported that another conflict took place near the colliery to-night as the men were coming out from work. The feeling runs high against the men who took the places of the strikers, and it is thought that there will be some bad work before the affair is ended.
