A WOMAN BADLY FROZEN.

WILKESBARRE, Penn., March 12.—Patrick Rainey, wife, and son live in a small shanty near the Hollenback Breaker, and are very poor. Two months ago Rainey's wife, while drunk, was out in a severe storm, during which time her hands and feet were badly frozen. The neighbors, not seeing or bearing anything of the woman for some weeks, became alarmed yesterday, and, visiting the house, found her lying in bed, the frozen portion of her body being mortified. She informed the neighbors that she had been unable to rest at night on account of the rats that have become so ferocious in the shanty; that they would run over her person and endeavor to feast on portions of the mortifled limbs. The Poor Directors will be informed this afternoon of the facts, and will be asked to relieve the woman by securing for her a physician and food.
