Breaker Boys Strike at Conyngham, Pa.

WILKESBARRE, Penn., July 28:—After declaring that the dust in the breaker was unendurable, the breaker boys at the Conyngham Colliery went on strike to-day. The 700 mine workers on strike at the Red Ash Colliery say the Conciliation Board is too slow to settle their grievances, and the leaders are urging that some other method of remedying the trouble must be found.

LIGHTNING KILLS LAWYER.

Eugene Devitt, His Wife, Child, and Sister Were Shocked.

Eugene Devitt, a young lawyer of Jersey City, died yesterday in Milford, Penn., as a result of a lightning stroke on Wednesday.

Mr. and Mrs. Devitt, their young child, and Miss Devitt, his sister, had been to Port Jervis, N. Y., and were driving back to Milford when a storm broke. Their carriage was struck by lightning and all in the party were shocked. They recovered in a few minutes and proceeded to their cottage. There Mr. Devitt, who was subject to heart failure, became worse. He rallied on Saturday, but on Monday he suffered a relapse which terminated fatally. The body was removed to Jersey City last night.
